Appendix A

Referral to Physician

The patient/client **<u>must</u>** be referred to a physician for medical clearance in each of the following instances (Ontario Medical Association – Red Flag List):

- 1. Asymmetric sensorineural hearing loss (>10 dB PTA and/or discrimination score difference>12%)
- 2. History of injury to ear or head
- 3. History of weakness of the face
- 4. Prior history of ear surgery, excluding myringotomy
- 5. History of drainage from the ear within the previous 90 days
- 6. History of dizziness or vertigo
- 7. Pain or discomfort in the ear within the previous 30 days
- 8. A significant change in hearing within the previous 90 days (>10 dB or 12 % change in discrimination score)
- 9. Audiometric air-bone gap equal to or greater than 15 decibels at 500 Hz, 1000 Hz and 2000 Hz
- 10. Age of 18 years or younger
- 11. Visible deformity of the ear (including perforation of the tympanic membrane)
- 12. Unilateral tinnitus
- 13. History of hearing loss in the family (other than age-related)
- 14. History of exposure to ototoxic drugs
- 15. History of meningitis
- 16. Suspicion of exaggerated hearing loss
- 17. History of exposure to loud noise
- 18. Excessive cerumen (wax) or a foreign body in the ear canal
- 19. Any person that the hearing health care professional feels should be seen by a physician
